I am happy to note that K-SOTTO has undertaken significant governance reforms aimed at strengthening the institutional and regulatory framework underpinning organ transplantation in Keralam. The Government's decision to bring all Zonal and Regional Offices under the unified administrative, functional, and financial control of the Executive Director has ensured greater uniformity in processes and decision-making across the State. Government has also established an enabling framework enabling K-SOTTO to pay fixed professional fees to experts engaged in deceased donor organ transplantation — a Public-Private Partnership model that will help build a sustainable backbone of skilled professionals for this critical, time-sensitive work. The empanelment of a statewide taxi and ambulance network further addresses long-standing logistical constraints in organ retrieval and transport. These measures reflect a deliberate policy direction: to move from institution-centric practice towards a standardized, transparent, and accountable statewide system, in keeping with the provisions of the Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act, 1994 and the Rules of 2014. The Government remains committed to ensuring that regulatory oversight through the District Level Authorization Committees and the State Level Technical Committee keeps pace with the growing scale of transplantation activity in the State, and to extending schemes such as the NOTP immunosuppressant support and funeral assistance for donor families to ensure equity for economically weaker sections.

I place on record my appreciation for the K-SOTTO team for translating these policy decisions into effective action on the ground and reaffirm the Government's continued support in advancing an ethical, equitable, and self-sufficient organ donation ecosystem in Keralam.

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ABOUT K-SOTTO

Keralam State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (K-SOTTO) is the apex state organization established by the Government of Keralam to regulate, coordinate, and promote organ and tissue donation and transplantation. It functions under the Department of Health and Family Welfare and ensures transparent, ethical, and equitable organ allocation across the state while implementing the provisions of the Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act (THOTA), 1994.

The evolution of K-SOTTO reflects Keralam's proactive response to the increasing demand for organ transplantation and the complexities associated with donor identification, organ allocation, logistics, and post-transplant follow-up. Prior to the establishment of a dedicated apex body, transplantation activities were largely institution-centric, leading to variations in practices and challenges in coordination. K-SOTTO was therefore conceived as a nodal government agency to integrate stakeholders across government and private healthcare institutions, enforcement agencies, and civil society, under a unified regulatory and operational framework.



LEGAL FRAMEWORK AND REGULATORY BASIS

The functioning of K-SOTTO is grounded in the national legal framework governing organ and tissue transplantation in India. The principal legislation guiding its mandate includes:

- The Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act (THOTA), 1994, as amended from time to time, which provides the statutory basis for the removal, storage, and transplantation of human organs and tissues for therapeutic purposes and for the prevention of commercial dealings.
- The Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Rules, 2014, which outline procedures related to donor authorization, certification of brain stem death, registration of transplant centres, organ allocation mechanisms, and maintenance of records and registries.

In accordance with these provisions, K-SOTTO functions as the State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (SOTTO) for Keralam, as envisaged under national policy. It operates in coordination with the National Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (NOTTO) and other regional and state-level networks, ensuring compliance with statutory requirements and national guidelines.

K-SOTTO is also responsible for facilitating the implementation of government orders, standard operating procedures, and ethical guidelines issued by the State Government in relation to transplantation activities.

EVOLUTION FROM KNOS TO K-SOTTO

Keralam established a structured deceased organ donation program through the **Kerala Network for Organ Sharing (KNOS)** since 2012.

Its major functions included:

- Maintaining waiting lists for transplant recipients.
- Coordinating deceased donor organ allocation.
- Promoting transparency and fairness in organ distribution.
- Supporting hospitals involved in organ transplantation.

KNOS played a crucial role in establishing Keralam as one of India's leading states in deceased organ donation.

To address the expanding needs in the organ transplantation field, the Government of Keralam established K-SOTTO as a registered charitable society under the Travancore-Cochin Literary, Scientific and Charitable Societies Act, 1955.

The organization functions as the **state apex body** for:

- Regulation of organ and tissue transplantation.
- Organ retrieval and allocation.
- Coordination among transplant hospitals.
- Policy formulation and implementation.
- Capacity building and public awareness.
- Monitoring compliance with THOTA and related rules

MISSION

The Organization is entrusted to make life saving transplants possible for patients in need. K-SOTTO leverage data and advances in science and technology to continuously strengthen the system, increase the number of organs recovered and the number of transplants performed, and ensure patients across the state have equitable access to transplants, striving towards to meet the demands of the end stage organ failure to have a fresh lease of life. The governing body chaired by the Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare and Women – Child Development guides the organization in formulating policies and the Executive Committee chaired by the Principal Secretary, Health and Family Welfare mentors the organization in day-to-day affairs.

The **Keralam State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (K-SOTTO)** is committed to strengthening and coordinating the organ and tissue donation and transplantation system across the State of Keralam. Its mission is to establish a transparent, ethical, and efficient framework that promotes deceased and living organ donation while ensuring that transplantation services are accessible, equitable, and accountable.

K-SOTTO strives to achieve this mission by fostering collaboration among healthcare institutions, transplant professionals, government agencies, non-governmental organizations, donor and recipient families, and the wider community. The organization emphasizes the importance of public awareness and education to encourage voluntary organ donation and dispel misconceptions surrounding the process. It also supports the development of standardized clinical practices, the use of modern technology for organ allocation and registry management, and evidence-based policy formulation to enhance the quality and effectiveness of transplantation services.

Through continuous monitoring, professional training, capacity building, and quality assurance initiatives, K-SOTTO seeks to ensure that every stage of the organ donation and transplantation process is conducted in accordance with the highest ethical, legal, and medical standards, ultimately improving patient outcomes and saving lives.

VISION

K-SOTTO envisions a future in which every individual suffering from end-stage organ failure has timely and equitable access to life-saving organ and tissue transplantation through a sustainable, transparent, and patient-centered healthcare system. The organization aspires to create a society where organ donation is widely recognized as a humanitarian act and is embraced as a shared social responsibility.

Its vision is to maximize organ and tissue donation by strengthening public trust, enhancing awareness, and establishing a robust statewide network for organ procurement and transplantation. K-SOTTO is dedicated to ensuring fairness and equity in organ allocation through scientifically validated allocation protocols, transparent governance, and continuous oversight.

Furthermore, the organization seeks to achieve self-sufficiency in organ and tissue donation within the state by promoting excellence in clinical care, research, innovation, and professional education. By upholding the principles of integrity, accountability, compassion, and collaboration, K-SOTTO aims to provide optimal care for donors and recipients while maintaining standards that are consistent with national regulations and internationally accepted best practices. Ultimately, its vision is to improve the quality of life and survival of patients with organ failure and contribute to a healthier and more compassionate society.

OBJECTIVES

The overarching objectives of K-SOTTO are to ensure ethical governance, equitable access, and optimal utilization of organs and tissues for transplantation in Keralam. Its key objectives include:

- To serve as office of the Appropriate Authority (A.A.) under the Transplantation of Human Organ and Tissues Act-1994, with one or more members of the Executive committee of the Society nominated and appointed by notification as Appropriate Authority under the provisions of the Act.
- To oversee and guide District Level and Hospital-Based Authorization Committees set up under the Transplantation of Human Organ and Tissues Act, 1994.
- To manage state-specific waiting lists for organs and if applicable, to tissues based on agreed and transparent criteria and ensure that all donated organs are allocated to the most appropriate recipient in compliance with the Transplantation of Human Organ and Tissues Act, 1994, its amendments and rules made there under.
- To develop and implement ethically and clinically sound transplant programs for the treatment of end-stage organ failure, consistent with meeting our State's overall healthcare needs and audit transplant procedures and outcomes to enable constant improvements in the safety and quality of organ transplants.
- To ensure the maintenance of a transplant database of all donors and recipients, including follow up data on living donors and recipients, and to ensure traceability and audit of the outcome of transplant programs.
- To prevent exploitative practices in organ transplantation that harms poor and vulnerable sections of the Society.
- To set standards for the screening and selection of potential living donors.
- To work towards networking all stakeholders in organ and tissue transplantation, including hospitals, medical personnel, organ and tissue donors, families of deceased donors, persons needing transplantation, persons having been transplanted, non-governmental organizations and individuals involved and State and Central Governments to collectively promote long, healthy and productive lives for persons with organ and tissue failure and those with health conditions leading to it.
- To work towards equitable access for all residents of state of Keralam to donation and transplant services and to organs procured from deceased donors.

OBJECTIVES

- To maximise the effectiveness of organ and tissue transplant surgeries by setting standards for donor management, organ recovery procedures and organizing and coordinating organ donation and procurement process and setting standards for organ and tissue packaging, labelling and transportation and by ensuring that arrangements are in place for safe and rapid transport of organs from donor hospital to the recipient hospital.
- To assist the Government of Keralam, Government of India and others in formulation of policies, procedures and establishment of regulatory frameworks for all kinds of organ and tissue transplantation as per various Acts, Rules and Government Orders, and any other matter referred to it.
- To ensure standardization, traceability, transparency, quality and safety as well as fairness and public trust in organ donation and transplantation services by providing accurate information to professionals on organ and tissue donation and transplantation outcomes.
- To initiate, implement, support and fund, both independently and in collaboration with others, to make transplant surgery affordable and accessible to economically weaker sections of Society.
- To provide consultancy services on all THOTA (Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act, 1994) and NOTP (National Organ Transplant Program) related matters and any other related issues pertaining to centres, institutions and hospitals located in the State.
- To ensure that all stakeholders involved in organ donation and transplantation in the State of Keralam are fully represented in the guidance and the proper functioning of the program.
- To facilitate multi-organ and tissue retrieval from a Brain stem / Cardiac death donor and including coordination of all steps involved in the procurement of organs and tissues from a donor until transplantation occurs into a recipient.
- To carry out Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activities including development of Information, Education and Communication material specific to the needs of the State for promotion of organ and tissue donation.
- Organizing and managing public relations and communication strategies on state-specific transplant issues.

OBJECTIVES

- To work in partnership with other medical institutions, health service departments, other concerned departments, universities, aid agencies, Non Governmental Organizations (NGO) and institutions of repute in India and abroad to bring in best practices in organ donation and transplantation.
- To conduct seminars, workshops and conferences, publish papers, theses, books periodicals and other literature, Institute fellowships, award scholarships and research grants etc. on organ donation and transplantation issues.
- To develop projects linked to scientific and technological advancement in processes related to organ/tissue donation and transplantation.
- To formulate organ allocation policies within the regulatory framework and update them regularly in consultation with all the stakeholders.
- To accredit transplant teams and or institutions allowed to perform organ transplants.
- To use the latest technologies such as Data Analytics and Artificial Intelligence for reviewing and analyzing waiting lists, analysis of allocation and waiting time for various organs and tissues to the extent possible to make all functions more effective and less costly.
- To do such things as may be incidental or conducive to attaining the objective of saving lives through organ transplantation in an ethical and socially acceptable manner and in compliance with the laws in force from time to time.

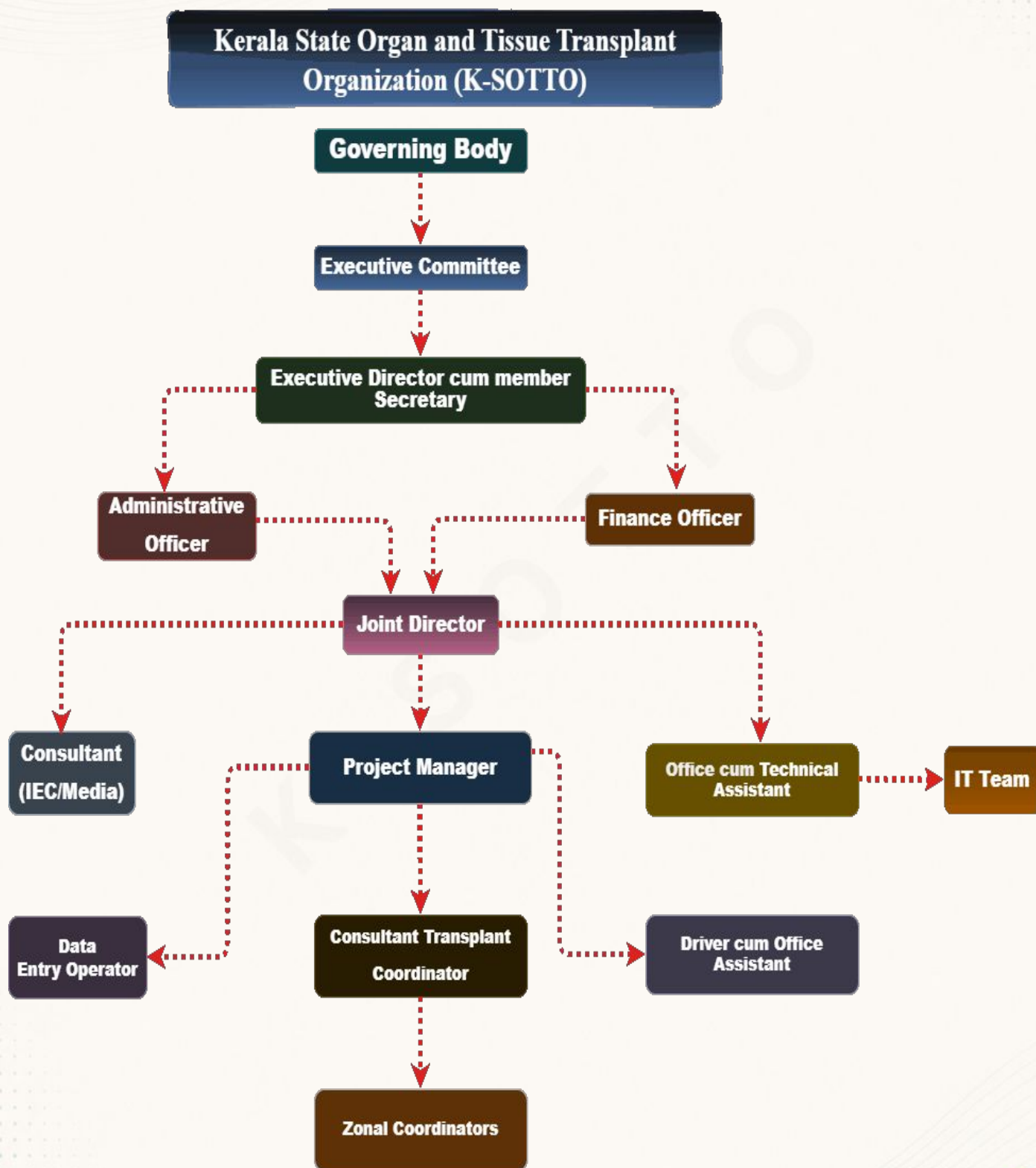

ZONAL & REGIONAL OFFICES

As part of implementation of erstwhile Deceased Donor Multi Organ Transplant Programme (DDMOTP), Keralam was divided into three Zones viz;

North Zone (Palakkad, Wayanad, Malappuram, Kozhikode, Kannur, Kasaragod) with Headquarter at Government Medical College, Kozhikode,

Central Zone (Kottayam, Idukki, Ernakulam, Thrissur) with Headquarter at Government Medical College, Kottayam and

South Zone (Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Pathanamthitta, Alappuzha) with Headquarter at Government Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram.

There also exists 2 regional offices at Government Medical College, Alappuzha and General Hospital, Ernakulam.

The Zonal Offices are facilitated by a Nodal Officer and an Assistant Nodal Officer who are faculties from the respective government medical colleges and transplant coordinator.

The Regional Offices are facilitated by Transplant Coordinator.

Since April 2025, the Zonal and Regional Offices are brought under the administrative, functional and financial control of the Executive Director, K-SOTTO.

This is aimed at ensuring uniformity in processes and decision-making, to hand hold transplant centres at zonal levels as and when needed.

LEGAL COUNSEL OF K-SOTTO

K-SOTTO has appointed a legal counsel aimed to, Provide legal advice and assistance to the Executive Director K-SOTTO and the Organization as needed.

To review and draft legal documents, MoUs, contracts, agreements and other pertinent materials on behalf of K-SOTTO.

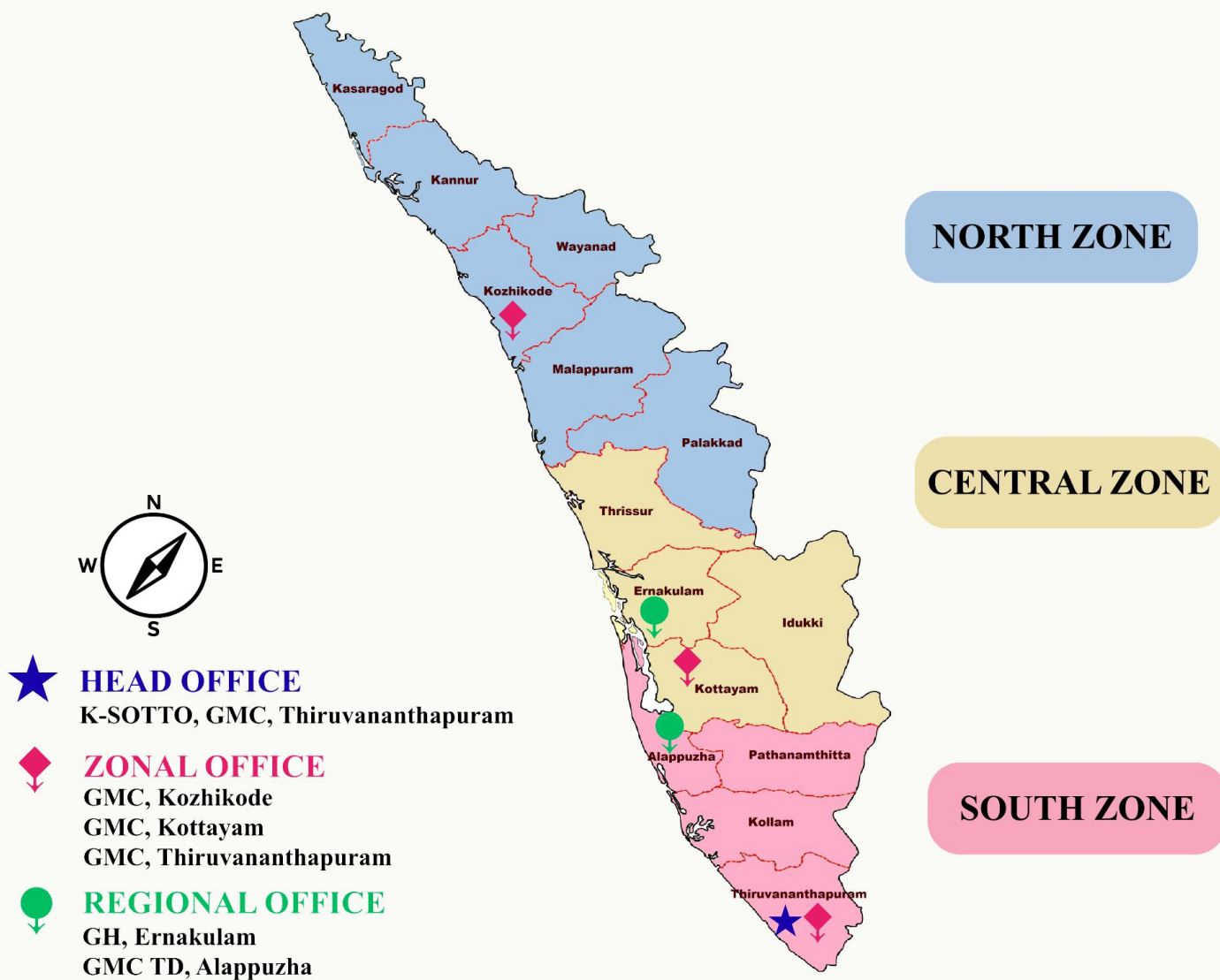
Representing K-SOTTO in legal matters, including negotiations, disputes and any legal proceedings as required.

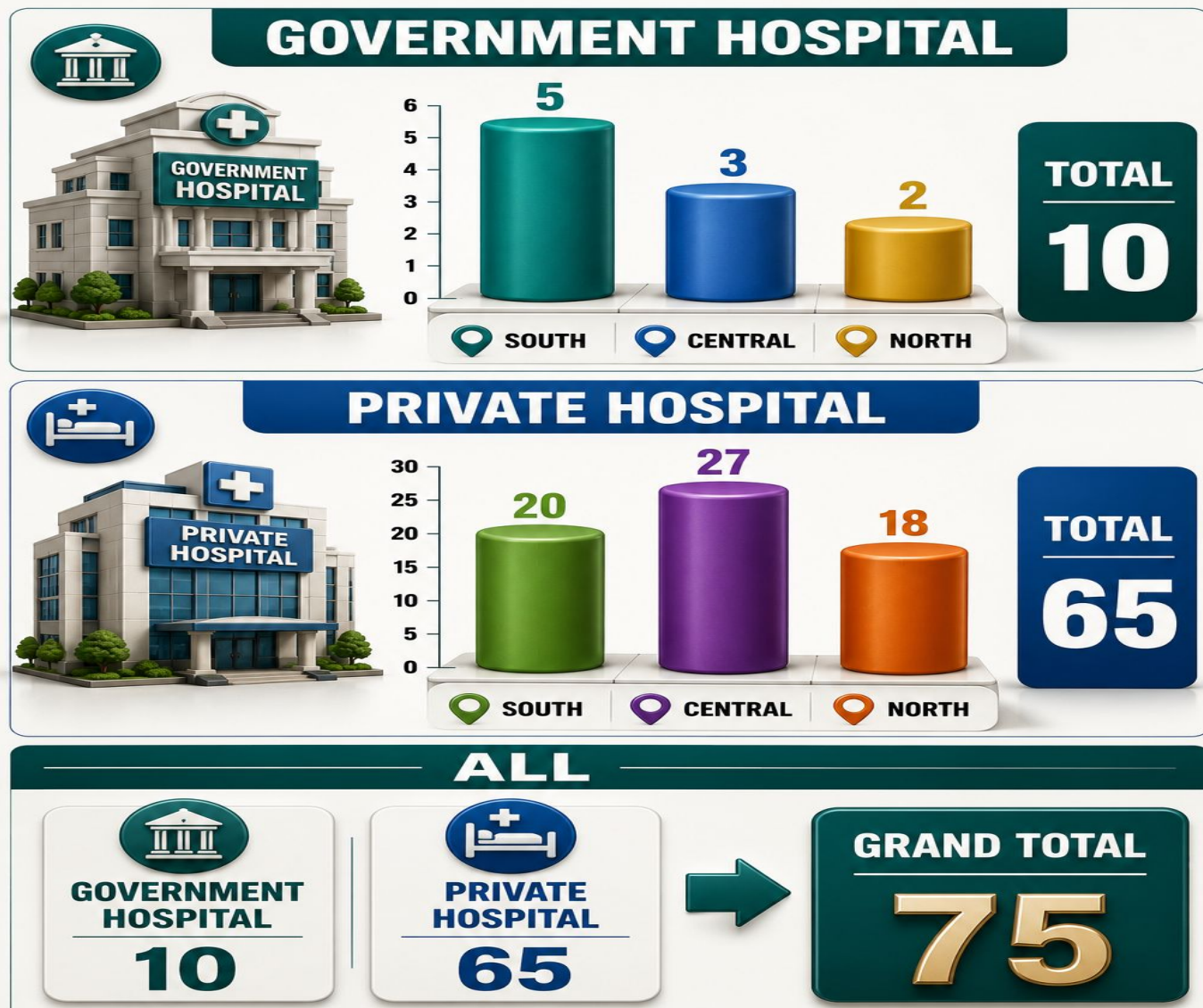

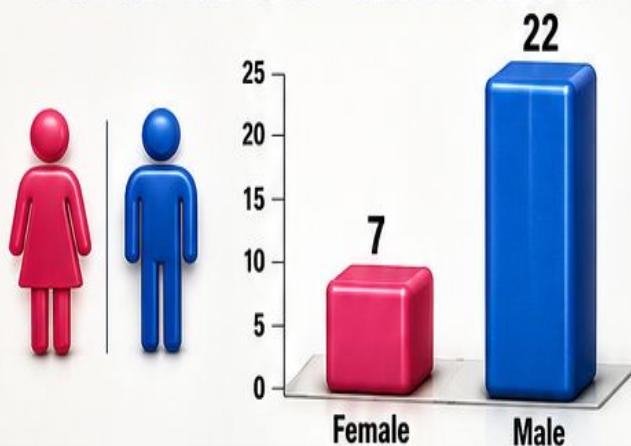

DECEASED DONATIONS - AGE WISE SPLIT



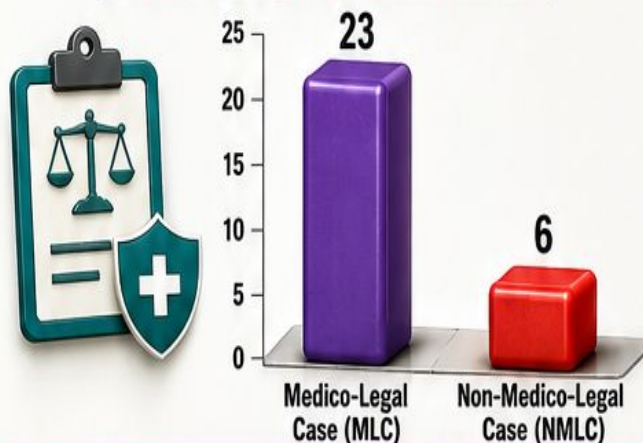

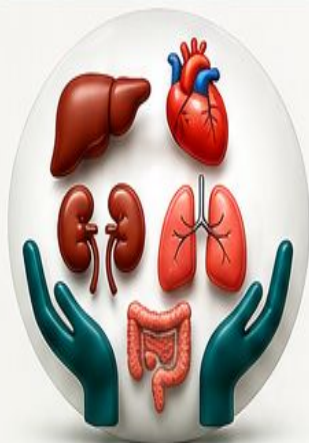

RAPID ORGAN AND TISSUE TRANSPORT SYSTEM

The Rapid Organ and Tissue Transport System was successfully activated during eight deceased organ donation cases in the State, ensuring the timely and safe transfer of life-saving organs and tissues to recipient transplant centres. Its successful operationalization was made possible through the seamless coordination of K-SOTTO in partnership with the Police Department, Traffic Police, donor hospitals, recipient hospitals, the media, and the wholehearted cooperation of the public. The aircraft officers, airport authorities and the railways also exhibited commendable support at the crucial hours.

The coordinated creation of "**Green Corridors**" and real-time inter-agency communication enabled the expeditious movement of organs across the State, reflecting the strength of Keralam's collaborative emergency response mechanism.

The Rapid Organ and Tissue Transport System ensured that every donated organ/tissue reached the recipient in the shortest possible time, ultimately translating the generosity of donor families into renewed lives for transplant recipients.

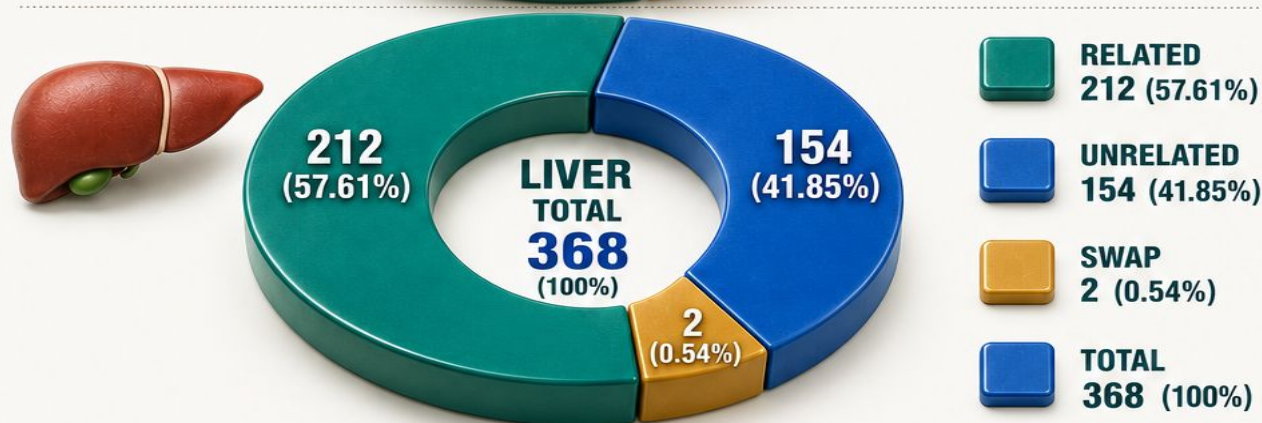
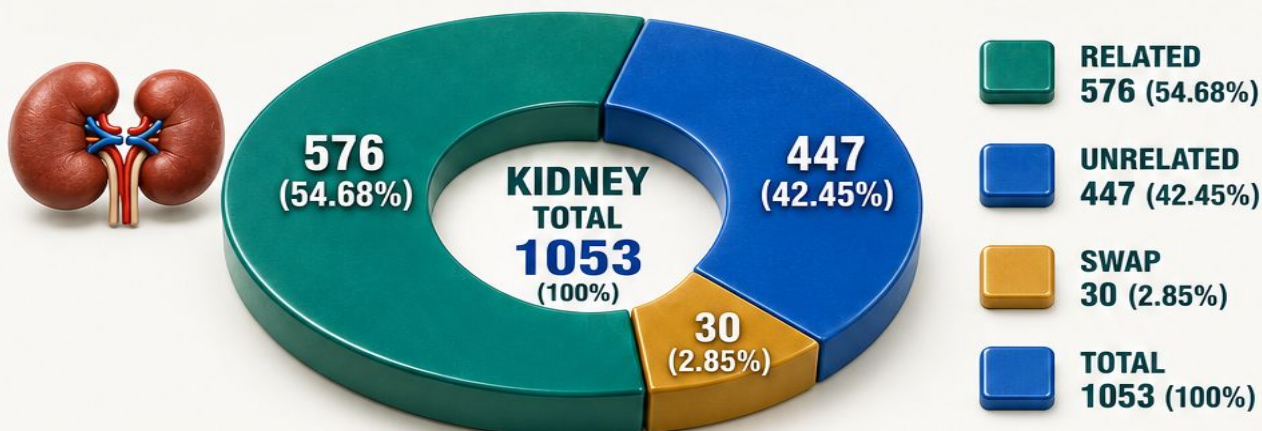

SMRITI VANDANAM 2025

STATE-LEVEL PROGRAMME TO HONOUR DECEASED ORGAN DONORS AND THEIR FAMILIES “SMRITHI VANDANAM”

Date: 2025 August 03

Venue: Tagore Theatre, Thiruvananthapuram

The Keralam State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (K-SOTTO) organized a state-level programme titled “*Smrithi Vandanam 2025*” on August 13 at Tagore Theatre, Thiruvananthapuram, to honour deceased organ donors and their families as part of national and international organ donation observances. The event was inaugurated by the hon. minister for Health, Family Welfare, Women and Child Development, Veena George, with Adv. Antony Raju, MLA, presiding. In her address, the Minister highlighted key government initiatives, including the provision of subsidized post-transplant medicines through Karunya Sparsham Zero-Profit Counters and insurance coverage for transplant surgeries, while also announcing that an official directive to recognize families who consent to organ donation would be issued soon. She described organ donation during moments of loss as one of the greatest acts of humanitarian generosity. The programme honoured 122 deceased organ donors whose donations between December 2017 and July 2025 helped save lives, and several transplant recipients also attended. Awards were presented to individuals and institutions for exemplary contributions in the field, including Dr. K. Subrahmanyam Iyer for advancements in hand transplantation, Dr. T.K. Jayakumar for leadership in cardiac surgery within the government sector, and Anu Kumari IAS, Collector of Thiruvananthapuram, for leading the *Jeeva Danam* organ donation initiative. Organ recipients Midhun Ashok and S. Sujith, who represented India at the World Transplant Games in Germany, were also recognized. Additional awards were given across the categories of Best Brain-Death Certification Model Hospital, Best Empanelled Doctor, Best Eye Banking Model, and Best NGO, acknowledging excellence and commitment in supporting deceased organ donation across the state.

SMRITI VANDANAM 2025

A video produced by KSFDC for K-SOTTO as part of organ donation awareness was also released during the event. Family members of deceased organ donors and organ recipients shared their personal experiences at the ceremony. Special registration counters were arranged near Tagore Theatre for those interested in registering as organ donors. The event witnessed the participation of around 500 people, including donor families, recipients, and leading experts in the field of transplantation.

NEW INITIATIVES

K-SOTTO LAUNCHES STATEWIDE TAXI AND AMBULANCE NETWORK TO STRENGTHEN ORGAN DONATION AND TRANSPLANT SERVICES

The Statewide Taxi and Ambulance network has now been made operational by K-SOTTO to meet the emergency transportation requirements associated with organ donation and transplantation.

The empanelled fleet includes air-conditioned cars, Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulances, and Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulances, ensuring the availability of appropriate vehicles based on operational requirements.

Upon identifying the need of a transport requirement, K-SOTTO informs the concerned district/state transport agency the type of vehicle required, the location, and the tentative time schedules of transport, following which the appropriate vehicle is mobilized without delay.

The transport network will be utilized for a wide range of activities related to organ donation and transplantation, including:

- Transporting empanelled doctors to hospitals for brain stem death certification.
- Rapid transportation of retrieved organs from organ retrieval centres to transplant hospitals.
- Transporting donor and recipient crossmatch samples to designated laboratories.
- Providing ambulance services to transport the deceased for post-mortem examination after organ retrieval and subsequently to their residence for funeral rites.
- Providing transportation for inspection teams evaluating hospitals for new transplant licences.
- Facilitating travel for medical audit teams visiting transplant hospitals.
- Supporting transportation for K-SOTTO training programmes conducted at medical institutions and public awareness events across the State etc.

The introduction of this dedicated transport network represents a significant systems-level intervention by K-SOTTO to reduce logistical barriers in organ transplantation, ensuring timely movement of organs and medical personnel, and ultimately strengthening the State deceased organ donation programme.

NEW INITIATIVES

PAYMENT OF PROFESSIONAL FEES TO PROFESSIONALS ENGAGED IN DECEASED DONOR ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION

To strengthen Keralam's deceased organ donation programme and ensure the availability of skilled professionals throughout the organ retrieval and transplantation process, the Government of Keralam issued G.O.(Ms) No.56/2026/H&FWD dated 19.02.2026, authorizing K-SOTTO to pay professional fees to experts, from outside the Government departments, hired during the process of deceased donor organ transplantation.

The Government sanctioned fixed professional fees for various categories of professionals hired during deceased donor organ transplantation, including intensivists, organ retrieval surgeons, transplant surgeons, anaesthetists, transplant coordinators, grief counsellors, trained transplant nurses, ICU and OT technicians, doctors accompanying organs, organ perfusionists, brain stem death certification teams, and transplant centre inspection teams.

This policy represents a significant governance reform by the Government of Keralam and K-SOTTO, creating a framework to leverage expertise and resources in a PPP Model to form the backbone of the deceased organ donation programme in the State.
